DISTANCES YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Clearance lights must be visible for at least 500'
- A disabled truck, bus or trailer during the night time shall have a flare at or near the vehicle and - one 100' to the rear and one 100' to the front
- In order to stop or turn your vehicle around on the highway - You must have 100' of clear road in both the front and rear
- Headlights are required at any time you cannot see persons or vehicles for 500' (because of snow, dust, fog, etc.) and - From 1/2 hour after sunset to 1/2 hour before sunrise
- Tail lights must be visible for 500'
- Headlights must illuminate persons and objects for 300' on high beam, 100' on low beam
- Motor vehicles at a railroad crossing shall stop and wait if an approaching train is within 150'
- When motor vehicles are required to stop at a railroad crossing, they must stop no closer than 15' and no further than 50' from the rails
- When meeting vehicles you are required to dim your lights when oncoming vehicles are within 1000'
- When following vehicles you are required to dim your lights when you approach within a distance of at least - 300'
- Signals for slowing, stopping or turning shall be given continuously for 100'
- Every motor vehicle must be equipped with clearance lights if it is at least - 60' wide
- The red warning flags placed at or near a disabled truck, trailer or passenger bus shall be - at least 12 square
- A motor vehicle horn must be loud enough to be heard for 200'
- It is unlawful to follow any fire apparatus traveling in response to an alarm closer than 500'
- Any motor vehicle must be equipped with signal lights when the distance from the center of the steering post to the rear limit of the body or load is more than 14'
- Brake lights must be visible in sunlight for 100'
- When passing another vehicle you must return to the right side of the roadway before coming within how many feet of any vehicle approaching from the opposite direction 100'
